If you are in a reading mode, may I suggest "Will Rogers—The Man and His Times". He was an icon of the early 20th century. Over 70 years have come and gone since his death and he still is respected and remembered for his many sayings.

He was born in 1880. During his life he was a performer in vaudeville and the Ziegfeld Follies in silent and talking pictures and radio.

In his stage debut of "Three Cheers", he replaced his friend who got injured, allowing only 2 weeks to learn his part but he did it. Perhaps it could be partially attributed to the fact that while on stage he never exactly followed the script. He knew the general "thought" but made up his own dialogue—causing anxiety for the other actors wondering "where is my que to come in".

Because he loved to meet and talk with people he became a well known world traveler. He became a very wealthy man but never lost sight of his "old country boy" beginnings. One of his famous quotes was "I never met a man I didn't like".

Another saying of his was "We spoiled the best territory in the world to make a state". He spoke of Oklahoma—his home state.

He made the statement "My ancestors didn't come on the Mayflower but they met the boat". He was part Indian.

In 1935, Will Rogers died along with his friend Wiley Post, the famous pilot of the early years of flight. "Taking off, the engine misfired on right bank while only fifty feet off water. Plane, out of control, crashed nose on ____". Upon the news of this tragedy John McCormack said "A smile has disappeared from the lips of America".

I highly recommend the reading of this interesting and informative book.


